Oregon Healthy Teens Survey for 8th Grade

Our school is participating in the Oregon Healthy Teens Survey (OHT), a survey sponsored by the Oregon Health Authority Public Health Division and the Oregon Department of Education. The survey will gather information about health risk behaviors of students in grades 8 and 11. The voluntary survey will be administered on April 11th in 8th grade homerooms. The survey includes questions about:

- Tobacco, e-cigarette, alcohol, marijuana and other drug use and access to substances;
- Physical activity and nutrition;
- Sexual health, including prevention of HIV, other sexually transmitted diseases, and unintended pregnancies;
- Mental health concerns such as depression, suicidal ideation, and bullying/harassment;
- Injury prevention (school safety, bullying, suicide, choking game, impaired driving);

- Health care access, use of School-Based Health Centers, and screening for conditions such as asthma;
- Positive youth development.

Our school and district uses the anonymous information to help better our schools. Attached is more information on this volunteer survey and a method to exempt your child if you do not wish for them to participate. If you do not want your child taking part in this survey, please return the attached form prior to April 11th. Thank you.

Flash Alert and Inclement Weather Info

If you haven't already, please sign up for Flash Alert www.flashalert.net and check our school website for snow bus routes <http://mrms.molallariv.k12.or.us/>. The district will post school closure and emergency information on flash alert. We can never be too prepared for our weather around here. In the event of an early dismissal, don't worry. **Please don't call us, your student will be calling you.** Under staff supervision, your student will call to establish your preferred method of getting them home; this allows both you and the school to both know exactly where your student is at all times.

Student Pickup

Just a reminder that if you are needing someone to pick up your student, due to illness, appointments, or any other non-emergency we need parents to notify the school prior to the student leaving. **All students leaving must be checked out in the main office.**

ASB (Student Body Fee)

Please remember to pay your students \$20 ASB fee. These fees go towards incentives, field trips, assemblies, and recognition activities for our students. Please help us provide a rewarding and exciting environment by paying the required ASB Fee (\$20) as soon as possible. This can be paid for online thru School Pay for your convenience.

Medication

All medication, both **prescription** and **non-prescription**, must be brought to the school office in their original container (Including inhalers, even if your student carries inhaler we still need box and paperwork). Students are **NOT** to transport medication to school; an adult must deliver all medication. Our office will provide medication forms to you upon request.

Report Cards
