Parent Drop Off

As you know it can pretty chaotic picking up your child, especially at the end of the day. If we could all follow the pattern below it would make things a bit easier on all of us. Thanks.

6th Grade Drop Off. Please drop your 6th grader off in the south parking lot next to the building and have them enter the gated entrance to the covered area. They must exit your car and be able to gain the sidewalk within a few steps. Once they are safely dropped off, pull around and exit via West Street, the graveled area to the south.

6th Grade Pick Up. To pick up your 6th grader, please pull into the south parking lot along West Street or use any of the available parking spots. Please DO NOT park in the bus parking spots at the front of the lot. Please DO have patience and use extreme caution.

7th and 8th Grade Drop Off. Please drop off your student either in the front of the building or in the north parking lot.

7th and 8th Grade Pick Up. Please pick up your student in the north parking lot. Please DO NOT use the bus pick up area. Please DO have patience and use extreme caution.

Student Pickup

Just a reminder that if you are needing someone to pick up your student, due to illness, appointments, or any other non-emergency we need parents to notify the school prior to the student leaving. **All students leaving must be checked out in the main office.**

ASB (Student Body Fee)
